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# Course Descriptions

All Art courses are intended to increase student understanding of Art historically and in modern society, while developing the technical skills necessary to create well composed works of Art.

- ART 1: Full year 1 credit Grades 9, 10, 11, 12 Fee Art I is a survey course designed to expose the beginning art student to: the various aspects of art criticism; ceramics; color theory; design; drawing; history; painting; and printmaking. Emphasis is placed upon technical skills to increase each student's confidence and capability of visual self-expression.
- **ART 2:** Full year 1 credit Prerequisite of Art I Grades 10, 11, 12 Fee The second year art student will continue to strengthen skills and knowledge from Art I. Art II focuses on the process of developing creative concepts.
- PAINTING: Semester 1/2 credit Prerequisite of Art I Grades 10, 11, 12 Fee Throughout this course, students utilize traditional painting techniques. The primary goal is to advance understanding about translating the subject onto the two dimensional surface. This course will build an understanding of the properties of light, aerial perspective, scale, and proportion. Special emphasis will be placed on color theory and mixing.
- PORTFOLIO DEVELOPMENT: Semester 1/2 credit Prerequisite of Art I and II 3.0 average in previous Art courses – Grade 11, 12 - Fee This course is designed for the serious art student who is interested in the creation of advanced level work. Course work is designed to develop a body of work (portfolio) highlighting a student's visual arts strengths and interests, which is suitable for application to an art school/college. May be taken concurrently with Art III with instructor's permission.
